**FROM THE DESK OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE  
ANNUAL REPORT OCTOBER 2021- SEPTEMBER 2022**

The Lake Tansi Police Department has had a busy and productive last twelve months. In October of 2021, the department moved out of the aging building on Dunbar Road to a new location already owned by the Lake Tansi Property Owner's Association across the street from the P.O.A. office. The old building belonged to the County and had come into disrepair and the department had long outgrown it. The new location is much more comfortable with more room and will enable us to continue to serve the community for many years to come.

One problem we had in the new building was the lack of storage space. With the help of the Lake Tansi Security Committee, Volunteer Electric VECustomer Share Program, Middle Tennessee Natural Gas Project Hometown Help, and donations from private citizens, the department was able to acquire a very nice storage building that solved our storage problems at no cost to the P.O.A.

Another good thing that has taken place for Lake Tansi is that the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department took the initiative to add full time animal control officers that are available to answer animal control calls and are equipped to handle the problems associated with this issue. They have been working hard and are doing a great service to Lake Tansi as well as the entire county.

As I am sure you all are aware of, there have been an increase in the last several years of active shooter situations in all areas of the United States. So far, Lake Tansi has been blessed to not have any mass shootings in our history however we are not immune from it. There are schools, a church, and several public gathering locations within our area. In a never-ending effort to be prepared to protect the people of Lake Tansi, the department has acquired patrol rifles and trained each officer in their use. These rifles have all been obtained through funds raised at no expense to the P.O.A.

In keeping with the topic of public safety, I also want to tell you about another item we have acquired this year. We have purchased devices to put in each patrol vehicle that are used to stop a vehicle pursuit. These are called STOP STICKS. They are tire deflation devices that when placed in the path of a fleeing vehicle, will deflate the tires in a controlled manner. This enables the pursuit to be ended in a much safer way.

The department also acquired a patrol vehicle to replace an aging unit that had reached the end of its serviceable life. It is a 2013 Police package Chevrolet Tahoe. It is four-wheel drive to enable us to continue service in inclement weather and the heavy suspension will hold up better to the deteriorating road conditions we are seeing in our area.

Another item acquired for the department at no expense to the P.O.A. is a car port large enough to park all three of our patrol vehicles under. This will help protect the investment the P.O.A. has made in our patrol vehicles.

Lastly, I want to mention the new officers we have hired this year. We have three new additions to the department. Their names are Dylan Cole, Gary Bolin, and Dustin Hoff. Each one brings experience with them to the department that will help us continue to serve the community efficiently with honor and respect.

As you can see, The Lake Tansi Police Department has had a good year and we look forward to serving you in the year to come.
